# **English Pronunciation for Global Professionals**

### Outcome

At completion of the program, students will speak in professional settings with a greater degree of comprehensibility and with more overall confidence in speaking skills. Students can convey nuanced meaning through pronunciation. Students complete the course with tools to target ongoing pronunciation issues.

### Objectives

- 1. Students will be able to speak with easy-to-understand segmental sounds.
- 2. Students will be able to apply knowledge of thought groups to speak with appropriate pausing for professional genres.
- 3. Students will be able to apply knowledge of suprasegmental stressed and unstressed elements to highlight key information within a sentence.
- 4. Students will be able to apply knowledge of suprasegmental linking and intonation to speak fluently and with intended meaning.

#### Administration

Length of total program: 24 hours Delivery: Zoom Materials: ICLS pronunciation activities, YouTube videos, authentic materials Levels: Open to students ranging from levels 201 to 402 (intermediate mid to advanced)

## **Program Outline**

Class 1

Language topic: Elements of sound production, /i/ vs. /ɪ/, falling intonation. Task: Participate in a dialogue to apologize for a mistake

Class 2 Language topic: /ʊ/ vs. /u/, stressed elements in a sentence. Task: Participate in a dialogue to clarify misunderstood information

Class 3 Language topic: The vowels of English, rising intonation. Task: Participate in a dialogue asking questions in a meeting (rise vs. fall intonation)



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Class 4

Language topic: Voiced vs. voiceless consonants at the end of a word, rise-fall-rise intonation Task: Participate in a dialogue to express agreement

Class 5 Language topic: Linking sounds and common reductions, paragraph analysis. Task: Participate in a dialogue to express surprise

Class 6 Language topic: /ð/ and / θ/ sounds, thought groups Task: Present an urgent situation

Class 7 Language topic: Word stress, two syllable word

Language topic: Word stress, two syllable words with first and second syllable stress Task: Pausing in a short presentation

Class 8 Language topic: International Phonetic Alphabet, paragraph analysis Task: Pausing in a short presentation (cont')

Class 9 Language topic: Review, stress on three-syllable words Task: Deliver a short presentation

Class 10 Language topic: Paragraph analysis, giving a speech Task: Deliver a short presentation using stressed and unstressed syllables

Class 11 Language topic: Light vs. dark /l/, review Task: Deliver a short presentation using stressed and unstressed syllables (cont')

Class 12 Language topic: Meaning differences behind stress, final project Task: Deliver the final presentation
